On the court

Stefanie Graf graced the tennis courts, and built a career that spanned 17 years and 902 victories. She officially announced her retirement from tennis in 1999.

Graf has won 22 Grand Slam singles titles (seven at Wimbledon, six at the French Open, five at the US Open and four at the Australian Open). In 1988, Graf won all four Grand Slam singles titles, the Olympic gold medal and 96 percent of her matches. Graf was ranked No. 1 for a WTA-record 377 weeks, including 186 in a row. She received the WTA Tour Player of the Year Award 1987-1990 and 1993-1996, and was voted by fans as the WTA Tour Most Exciting Player in 1996, 1998 and 1999.

Off the court

Stefanie is the founder and chairperson of The Children for Tomorrow Foundation, a non-profit organization focused on helping children and their families who are victims of war, persecution or organized crime. She even has a life-size wax figure on display at the famed Grevin Wax Museum in Paris.

In October 2001, Graf married Andre Agassi, and the couple has two children, Jaden Gil and Jaz Elle.
