Mother-of-pearl is a hard, iridescent inner layer of certain shells, including abalone, pearl oyster, and mussel. Mother-of-pearl is composed chiefly of calcium carbonate deposited in thin, overlapping layers.

The iridescent play of colors for which it is known is caused by the interference of reflected light waves. In both Eastern and Western cultures, mother-of-pearl has a long history of use in decorative finishes and inlays.
